As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE FIRST READING: Genesis 50:15-21

When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." <sup>16</sup>So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died, <sup>17</sup>'Say to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.' And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. <sup>18</sup>His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." <sup>19</sup>But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of

God? <sup>20</sup>As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. <sup>21</sup>So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones.” Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

Leader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

THE SECOND READING: Romans 14:1-12

As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions. <sup>2</sup>One person believes he may eat anything, while the weak person eats only vegetables. <sup>3</sup>Let not the one who eats despise the one who abstains, and let not the one who abstains pass judgment on the one who eats, for God has welcomed him. <sup>4</sup>Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make him stand. <sup>5</sup>One person esteems one day as better than another, while another esteems all days alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. <sup>6</sup>The one who observes the day, observes it in honor of the Lord. The one who eats, eats in honor of the Lord, since he gives thanks to God, while the one who abstains, abstains in honor of the Lord and gives thanks to God. <sup>7</sup>For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. <sup>8</sup>If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. <sup>9</sup>For to this end Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living. <sup>10</sup>Why do you pass judgment on your brother? Or you, why do you despise your brother? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God; <sup>11</sup>for it is written, “As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God.” <sup>12</sup>So then each of us will give an account of himself to God.

Leader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 18:21-35

Peter came up and said to [Jesus], “Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?” <sup>22</sup>Jesus said to him, “I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven. <sup>23</sup>“Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. <sup>24</sup>When he began to settle, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. <sup>25</sup>And since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. <sup>26</sup>So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, ‘Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.’ <sup>27</sup>And out of pity for him, the master of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. <sup>28</sup>But when that same servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, ‘Pay what you owe.’ <sup>29</sup>So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him, ‘Have patience with me, and I will pay you.’ <sup>30</sup>He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the

debt. <sup>31</sup>When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. <sup>32</sup>Then his master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. <sup>33</sup>And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' <sup>34</sup>And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. <sup>35</sup>So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

## The Teaching of the Church

**In-Person Sunday School and Bible Classes Resume September 13** for all ages! Classes will meet from 9:15-10:15 a.m. and include the following:

**Racial Justice and the Christian Life** will explore the roots and history of racial injustice in America and see how God's Word and Jesus' example can help us confront racism, replacing fear, ignorance, and indifference with Christian love, forgiveness, mercy, and justice. We will incorporate films, articles, and weekly presenters to foster discussion. Each class will conclude with a study of Scripture. The class is about discovering and understanding; it is not about politics or political points of view. Pastor Tom E. Eggold will facilitate the class which will meet in the gym with its excellent A/V system and plenty of room for social distancing with masks. Will run from September 13—November 22.

**Lutheran Christianity** is designed for every new member and anyone else who'd like to explore what Lutherans believe and why we believe it. Questions about God, faith, and church are welcomed. This class will meet in Ebenezer Hall and will run from September 13—December 6. The course will be taught by Pastor Eggold, Pastor Sheafer, Pastor McFadden and Lana Hille.

**High School Bible Study** will meet in School Activity Center and will be led by Mr. Smith.

**Youth Confirmation** at Emmanuel is a three-year program for our sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. All classes meet on Sundays from 9:15-10:15 a.m. and begin on Sunday, September 13.

**Sixth Grade Confirmation** will explore Luther's Small Catechism by connecting Luther's teaching to Bible stories. Class will be led by Mr. and Mrs. Bowland, Mr. Eggold, and Dr. and Mrs. St. John, and will meet in Room 102.

**Seventh Grade Confirmation** will help our students apply the teachings of the Bible to their lives as believers. Some of the topics covered are church history, vocation, relationships, forgiveness and stewardship. This class will be facilitated by Mr. and Mrs. Burns, Mr. and Mrs. Clark, Mr. and Mrs. Moellering, and Mr. and Mrs. Steffen, and will meet in Room 101.

**Eighth Grade Confirmation** students and at least one parent are required to attend confirmation class together as our pastors lead an in-depth exploration of Luther's Small Catechism, culminating with the rite of confirmation for our eighth-grade students on May 2, in the 10:30 a.m. service. ## BUILDING FAITH IN THE FAMILY

### FORGIVENESS

In last week's story, Jesus told His disciples that being humble is a way of being great in God's eyes. He ended by telling them to forgive anyone who sins against them. Then Peter—always quick to speak up—said, "So, Lord, how many times do I have to forgive somebody who sins against me? As many as *seven times*?" (Peter thought Jesus would be impressed and think Peter was really good at forgiving.)

Jesus looked at Peter for a long minute. "No, Peter, not seven times. You must forgive him seventy-seven times." Then, to help Peter and all the disciples understand what He meant, Jesus told a story.

### PARDON ME

The word "forgive" comes from a Latin word *perdonare*, which means to give completely. (The word "pardon" also comes from *perdonare*.) When we forgive someone, we forgive completely, we pardon them. Not easy at times. But God does this for us, and He will give us power to forgive folks who hurt us.

### FAMILY TIME

Talk about forgiveness with your family. Most families need a lot of forgiveness—from God and from one another. Let everybody answer these questions: *When is it hardest for you to forgive somebody? Why do you think that is? Who are the hardest people for you to forgive? Can you remember a time when you forgave—really forgave—somebody? How did you feel afterward?*

Is there anybody in your family who needs your forgiveness? Can you give it to them? Is there anybody whose forgiveness you need? Can you ask them for it? *(Be sure to ask God for help with both of these.)*

### FILL-IN PRAYERS

*Say the following prayers with your family—out loud or silently—filling in the blanks for yourselves.*

Dear God, I'm having a really hard time forgiving \_\_\_\_\_ for \_\_\_\_\_. Please fill my heart with Your love and strength so I can forgive as You have forgiven me. Amen.

Dear God, I am so angry that I feel like hurting \_\_\_\_\_ rather than forgiving them. Please help me to get rid of my anger and tell them about my feelings. Then help me to forgive them. Thank you. Amen.

Dear God, I am sorry I did \_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_. Please forgive me and then give me courage to apologize and ask for their forgiveness. Amen.
