## The Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost – Proper 24

### Read Psalm 96:1-9

- <sup>1</sup>Oh sing to the LORD a new song;  
sing to the LORD, all the earth!
- <sup>2</sup>Sing to the LORD, bless his name;  
tell of his salvation from day to day.
- <sup>3</sup>Declare his glory among the nations,  
his marvelous works among all the peoples!
- <sup>4</sup>For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised;  
he is to be feared above all gods.
- <sup>5</sup>For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols,  
but the LORD made the heavens.
- <sup>6</sup>Splendor and majesty are before him;  
strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.
- <sup>7</sup>Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples,  
ascribe to the LORD glory and strength!
- <sup>8</sup>Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name;  
bring an offering, and come into his courts!
- <sup>9</sup>Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness;  
tremble before him, all the earth!

### Read Isaiah 45:1-7

1. Read Isaiah 44:28. Who is mentioned by name and what title is he given? What is the significance of this title?
2. Cyrus ruled the Persian Empire from 559 to 530 B.C. His conquest of Babylon in 539 B.C. allowed him to release the Jews from captivity. Note that Isaiah prophesied more than a century and a half before the ascendancy of Cyrus. What do the following references tell us about this future Persian king?
  - Ezra 1:1-4:
  - II Chronicles 36:22-23:
3. In today's text, the prophet writes as though God is speaking to Cyrus in the present tense. What is the title Isaiah gives to Cyrus in verse one? Why is this title significant?

4. What specific promises are made to Cyrus in this text?
  - Isaiah 45:1
  - Isaiah 45:2
  - Isaiah 45:3
5. Why will God give Cyrus this kind of success? See Isaiah 45:4.
6. What do verses 4 and 5 say about the faith of King Cyrus?
7. What does God say about His power and work in verse 7?
8. Read the rest of chapter 45. What additional information does God reveal about the ways in which He operates in our lives? Is this comforting to you? See also Romans 8:28 and II Timothy 2:10.

**Read Matthew 22:15-22**

9. What motivates the Pharisees to send “their disciples...along with the Herodians” to question Jesus?
10. How does this story, relate to the Old Testament reading from Isaiah and what is its application for the way we live out our lives in the world?

**Devotional Thought from “The Lutheran Study Bible”**
